Record Breakers will bring together the worlds of fact and fiction, challenging young readers to explore some of the astonishing real life achievements and world records featured in the Guinness World Records books. Collecting stickers as they go, young readers will discover weird, wonderful and wacky records from around the world in 6 different categories: cool tech, way to go!, the big stuff, animal magic, human touch and action! adventure!

The scheme is free and flexible for all families and children just need to read 6 books by **Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2015**.
