Record Breakers - Summer Reading Challenge 2015



This year's Record Breakers Summer Reading Challenge, produced by The Reading Agency, in association with Guinness World Records, launched in all libraries on **Saturday 11 July 2015**.

Record Breakers will bring together the worlds of fact and fiction, challenging young readers to explore some of the astonishing real life achievements and world records featured in the Guinness World Records books. Collecting stickers as they go, young readers will discover weird, wonderful and wacky records from around the world in 6 different categories: cool tech, way to go!, the big stuff, animal magic, human touch and action! adventure!

The scheme is free and flexible for all families and children just need to read 6 books by **Saturday 12th September 2015**. Children will receive rewards for each book they read and those that read all six will receive a medal and certificate. School uniform

As the summer holidays come closer and the 'Back to School' signs appear in the shops (!) a reminder of the Autumn/Winter school uniform in case you wish to stock up:

A navy school sweatshirt* or cardigan* with a red polo shirt*.

Grey trousers or grey skirt.

Navy, fleece-lined showerproof jacket* (optional)

Socks should be grey or white. Tights should be grey, black or navy.

Shoes should be sensible 'school' shoes and not trainers, boots or open-toed sandals.

PE Kit

All children need a PE kit which should be kept in school at all times in a PE bag (supplied by the school).

Red T shirt* with plain navy shorts.

All children need plimsolls (or trainers) to change into for outdoor PE lessons. We prefer black elasticated or velcro plimsolls for the younger children.

Navy jogging trousers may be worn in cold weather.

Swimming All children need a swimming costume/trunks and a towel. A bag is supplied by the school.
