### **SINGLETON HAS DAY FOR CHANGE FOR UNICEF**

As you know, on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> May, just before half term, we joined thousands of schools across the country by taking part in UNICEF's Day for Change to raise funds for UNICEF's work - helping millions of vulnerable children around the world.

The pupils came to school dressed in blue and white (the UNICEF colours) in return for making a donation to support the UNICEF campaign to tackle malnutrition in Liberia, which raised over £80. Pupils led the school assembly on that day and took part in a range of fun activities linked to raising awareness of the issue of malnutrition. These included weaving webbing in the blue and white colours of UNICEF around the school perimeter fencing, decoupage plates with images of food and decorating t-shirts with the Day for Change message. The afternoon saw the children themselves creating an aerial photograph of the UNICEF message and we rounded off the day with a walk around the village in their newly created t-shirts to promote UNICEF's message of tackling malnutrition
