Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Singleton Primary School will:

- measure the impact of the interventions by tracking the progress of the pupil premium pupils on a termly basis.
- measure the success of pupils at the end of EYF, KS1 and KS2 relative to their school targets, FFTD targets and against threshold measures.
- monitor and support pupils in accessing pastoral support and discuss their progress and needs regularly

The 2016/17 allocation made a difference to the attainment of disadvantaged children through:

The parents whose children are entitled to the PPG have been pleased not to have to worry about paying for educational visits, residentials and were delighted to see their child's enjoyment in taking part in an after school (paid for) club.

The school is committed to improving achievement of all pupils and narrowing the gaps between outcomes of children eligible to PPG and those from wealthier families.

The respective children's progress and attainment is tracked and monitored carefully to ensure they achieve their full potential. The School's governing body are given regular updates on their progress and how the money has been spent on each individual child throughout the year.
